Nurses play a vital role in sexual and reproductive health service provision through health promotion and education, assessment and screening.

Family Planning Victoria is the leading provider of professional education in this field and offers courses for Division 1 nurses practising in primary health, community and school settings.

Courses

1. Comprehensive Sexual and Reproductive Health (Nursing) course.
2. Pap Test and Introduction to Sexual Health (Nursing) course.

Both courses are accredited by the Royal College of Nursing, Australia.

To undertake the courses, you must have at least two years' post registration experience. To undertake the necessary clinical placements, you must be a Registered Division 1 Nurse and hold current registration in Victoria.

After completing each course, you will receive a Certificate of Completion.

Nurses who successfully complete both courses will receive the Certificate in Sexual and Reproductive Health (Nursing).

If you wish to undertake the full certificate, you must complete both courses within two years. We recommend you complete the courses in the above order to minimise your workload and the number of clinical placements. However, flexible arrangements will be considered.

Recognition of Prior Learning is available to nurses who seek credits for previous study and / or existing skills (fees apply).

Comprehensive Sexual and Reproductive Health (Nursing)

1 - 5 March 2010 or

3 - 7 May 2010 or

23 - 27 August 2010

This five-day course provides up-to-date, evidence-based information on broader issues in sexual and reproductive health. It has a strong focus on contraception and sexually transmissible infections. It explores the physiological, social and environmental aspects of sexual and reproductive health, using

current research findings, clinical guidelines and the knowledge and skills of experts in the field.

- Contraception
- Sexually transmissible infections
- Vaginal and vulval health
- Continence

- Sexual difficulties and disorders
- Sexual assault and domestic violence
- Adolescent sexual health
- Sexual diversity
- Disability and sexuality
- Cultural diversity

- Men's sexual health

Pap Test and Introduction to Sexual Health (Nursing)

22 - 25 March 2010 or

7 - 10 June 2010 or

13 - 16 September 2010

This four-day course will enable you to develop the clinical knowledge required to become a Pap test provider. It includes intensive sessions on your role and practice as a Pap test provider and introduces the topics of contraception, sexually transmissible infections and breast health.

To complete this course, participants must undertake clinical placements and assessments with approved Victorian preceptors. During placements, participants must complete a minimum of 15 Pap tests. The time taken to complete these varies between students but most students need approximately 50 hours. Placements must be completed within six months. This can be very demanding alongside workbook submission, paid work and personal commitments. Please consider this carefully when applying and refer to the Acknowledgement Form for the Pap Test & Introduction to Sexual Health (Nursing) course. This form is to be completed and returned with your registration form.

Please note: Course participants must organise their own placements. The final assessment must take place at Family Planning Victoria.

Course content

The following topics are covered by classroom sessions, readings, reference sheets or workbook activities:

- Role of a nurse Pap test provider
- Assessment skills and sexual history taking
- Principles of population screening

- Cervical cytology and Human Papilloma Virus
- Pap test theory and clinical skills
- Treatment of abnormal Pap tests
- Management of Pap test results
- Policy, clinical guidelines and medico-legal issues
- Pap test provider credentialing
- Tutor client session and role play
- Introduction to gynaecological conditions and sexually transmissible infections
- Introduction to contraception
- Breast health
- Past history of sexual assault and Pap testing
- Setting up a well women's clinic

Assessment

- Pre-course worksheet
- Attendance at four-day course
- Completion of a tutor client session which involves taking a sexual history and mock Pap test from a live model
- Completion of workbook within three months of finishing the theory course
- Demonstration of clinical competencies during clinical placements (to be completed within six months of finishing the theory course) with approved Victorian preceptors
- Completion of a clinical portfolio including reflective case study within six months of completing the theory course

Outcomes

- Family Planning Victoria's certificate in Pap test and Introduction to Sexual Health (Nursing)
- Eligibility to be credentialed as a Nurse Pap Test Provider with a Victorian Cytology Service Provider Number
